Communication At EHPS

At EHPS we use a number of methods to communicate with our parents and families.



Audiri is our main source of communication for parents about school. We provide reminders, updates, and copies of notes etc. It is free to download for Apple or Android users.



Our School Facebook page is used to provide reminders, flyers, advertise events within the school and is where we share photos of our events and activities.

Our P&C also have a Facebook page.



Our school uses School Bytes as our method for permission and payments for school activities. Communication is sent to families through email, so it's important that your email details are always up to date. When an activity occurs, families will receive an email that provides information about the activity, parents permission is signed digitally and payment can be made directly through the link on the email. Paper copies can be provided upon request.



Seesaw is an online communication platform. Classroom teachers use it to showcase student work and achievements. This is not a two-way communication system.

School Map




Kiss & Ride and Bus Zone

Edgeworth Heights Public School's Kiss and Ride Zone has been re-designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, the zone minimises congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers.

The zone operates under the same conditions as no parking zones:

- You may stop to drop off or pick up your children for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- You are required to remain in, or within 3 metres of your vehicle.
- The zone operates as a Kiss and Drop Zone between 8:00-9:30am and 2:30-4:00pm. It is unrestricted parking out of these times.



Cars 1 - 3 drive away once children are safely in the car or dropped off at school. Drop off and pick up zones will be marked by school witches' hats.

If there are no car spots available in the Kiss and Ride Zone you MUST drive around the block and try again.

To register for a Kiss and Ride name card please contact our school office. The school will provide you with a family name card to clearly display on your front windscreen or visor when collecting students in the afternoon.

Morning Drop Off Procedure:

- Parent/carer drives into Kiss and Ride Zone and moves to the most forward position.
- Student takes off seatbelt and exits the car using the door closest to the curb.
- Student walks to the school gate independently.
- Parent drives from Kiss and Ride Zone safely.
- Please DO NOT queue over staff driveway.

Afternoon Pick Up Procedure:

- Staff member to walk students to Kiss and Ride Zone.
- Family Kiss and Ride name card clearly displayed on windscreen or visor.
- Parent drives to the most forward position. Parent to stay in car. Child MUST enter from the door closest to the curb.
- Cars exit Kiss and Ride in the order of arrival. i.e., No car leaves before the car in the first position exits the Kiss and Ride area. This is for the safety of our students crossing at the crossing.



Bus Zone:

The bus zone is strictly <u>No Parking.</u> Please keep this area clear so that staff members can ensure all students are moved safely to their designated buses.

Administration

Morning Supervision

Teachers on duty begin supervision at 8:30am. Students are not to arrive before 8:30am.

Late Arrivals or Early Leavers

If your child is late to school (after 9:00am) or needs to be picked up early (before 2.55pm) you will need to proceed to the office to notify the office that your child is late or leaving. If your child is leaving early, please contact the office to ensure your child and their bag is in the foyer waiting.

Sick at School

If your child is sick or injured at school, they will be sent to the sick bay in the office. Our First Aid Officer will decide if the student requires first aid, monitoring or if their parent/carer is to be contacted.

MERIT AWARDS

Teachers hand out 3 (K-2) or 4 (3-6) Merit Awards each week at our school recognition assembly for students showcasing our PBL expectations.

Once a student receives 2 awards they can take them to the office to receive 1 Mini Echo to go towards their 10, 20, 30, 40, 50 Echo Awards.







PRINCIPAL AWARDS

The principal can give out principal awards at any time during the Term.

Students can show 2x Principal Awards at the office to receive 1 Mini Echo.

Students can show 1x Principal Award + 1x Merit Award at the office to receive 1 Mini Echo to go towards their 10, 20, 30, 40, 50 Echo Awards.









SALTIES

Salties are handed out each day during play times and in class to students showing PBL expectations.

The whole school will receive a reward day when we fill our Salties barrel.

5 students at random will be drawn from the Salties barrel once a week to receive a \$1 Canteen voucher.




ECHOES (




EHPS Reading Gems

Reading Gems are a whole school home reading program. It allows students to build fluency, comprehension, word-solving and a love of reading in a supportive environment.

Students log 25 nights reading or being read to at home. Every 25 nights that are logged students are acknowledged with an award, gem sticker (goes onto the class bag) and students 'level up' to the next gem.

They can read as many books in one night but only the one night is logged.



Library and Technology

At EHPS students engage with future focused learning outcomes in a supportive environment that utilises progressive teaching techniques to engage every student. Students visit the library weekly to explore and engage in hands on activities that support knowledge construction. Technology is incorporated to enhance all student's learning experiences and equip them with necessary skills as a 21st Century learner. A variety of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) activities add to students authentically utilising technology in the classroom and in connecting to real word learning.





<u>Library Borrowing</u>

Each week students will have the opportunity to browse our library collection and borrow. Students are able to borrow up to 4 books weekly. A library bag is required to borrow. The Library is open during some of the breaks during the week for students to borrow books or engage with technology.

Education




